Via Montenapoleone, Milano: Bally invites young Artist Lucio Salvatore to Exhibit his photo-paintings during the Furniture and Design Fair 2006.

Lucio Salvatore, born in Italy but a citizen of the world is invited to exhibit a series of large scale photographs in the heart of famous Via Montenapoleone in Milan – this exhibition was part of a collaboration that Salvatore had with the Swiss shoes and accessories manufacturer Bally.

Salvatore lives and works between Italy, New York and Brazil where as an artist he started photographing a series of landscapes in Rio de Janeiro – his art moved rapidly toward a more innovative artistic exploration rooted in the artist studies of Philosophy.

For the exhibition in Via Montenapoleone Salvatore gathers artworks created in the Countryside of Lazio where he found inspiration for a series of photo-paintings entitled “Photomenology” which had a great success of public and critics.

Valeria Marini, Francesco Mondadori, Alessandro Cecchi Paone, Paola Barale, were guests of honour and all the major Italian TV networks from TG1 to La 7 covered the event presenting Salvatore as one of the most talented emerging Italian Artists.
